
Diocese of Dallas Patch Program Leader's Guide

Please complete the four requirements listed below. Refer to the Reference Material sheet for books and websites of importance.

- Research the Diocese of Dallas. Completed timeline from 1890 to the present, which highlights events of historical importance should look like the following:
- 1890 Diocese of Dallas established by Pope Leo XIII
 Bishop Thomas Brennan installed as 1st Bishop of Dallas
- 1893 Bishop Edward Dunne installed as 2nd Bishop of Dallas
- 1902 Sacred Heart Cathedral completed and dedicated in Dallas
- 1911 Bishop Joseph Lynch installed as 3rd Bishop of Dallas by Pope Pius X and served for 43 years, the longest term of any USA Bishop
- 1954 Bishop T. K. Gorman installed as 4th Bishop of Dallas.
- 1965 Holy Trinity Seminary founded
- 1969 Bishop Gorman retires as Bishop of Dallas
 Diocese of Dallas Ft. Worth is divided into two dioceses by
 Pope Paul VI
 Bishop Thomas Tschoepe installed as 5th Bishop of Dallas
- 1977 Sacred Heart Cathedral renamed Cathedral Shrine of the Virgin of Guadalupe. (Cathedral Santuario de Guadalupe)
- 1990 Bishop Charles Grahmann installed as 6th Bishop of Dallas
- 2007 Bishop Kevin Farrell installed as 7th Bishop of Dallas. Previously, the Bishop of the Archdiocese of Washington, D.C. On August 15, 2016, Bishop Farrell was appointed to the Vatican as Prefect of the Dicastery for the Laity, Family and Life.
- 2017 Bishop Edward J. Burns installed as the 8th Bishop of Dallas. Previously, the Bishop of the Diocese of Juneau.


a. Research the symbolism for the coat of arms for the Diocese of Dallas at. Label the four areas as indicated.



Diocese of Dallas Coat of Arms

- A. The Bishop's Mitre, symbol of their office
- B. Crossed Swords, symbol of St. Paul
- C. Three Fleur de Lis, symbol of the Holy Trinity and the wavy band represents the Trinity River
- D. Star represents the Lone Star of Texas

 Research the coat of arms for the current Bishop. Label the four areas as indicated.



- A. The blue (Azure) symbolizes the separation from the worldly values and the ascent of the soul toward God.
- B. The gold (Or), the most noble metal, symbol then of the first Virtue, the Faith.
- C. Coat of Arms of the Diocese of Dallas
- D. Bishop Burn's motto
- E. Botonny processional cross with five red stones to represent the Five Wounds of Christ.
